INFORMATION REGARDING OFFICE MOVE

CLASS "B" CHECK-IN RULE

To be eligible to work Saturday, a man must be checked in the previous day. He must have been available two straight-time days during the week. EXCEPTIONS: Men returning from vacation, illness, Union business, and/or collective bargaining. A flop shall count as a day of availability on the day before an overtime day only for the purpose of working Saturday or a holiday. To be eligible to work a holiday, a man must be available on the previous day, except if a holiday falls on a Monday. **This rule applies to both Dayside and Nightside Class B's**

FROM THE BUSINESS AGENTS

Pacific Coast Marine Safety Code - Rule 651. All employees shall be required to wear a protective helmet at all times when working in areas where there is a potential for injury to the head from falling objects. All such equipment issued after January 1, 2000 shall comply with American National Standards Institute ANSI Z 89.1, 1997 (Personal Protection - Protective Headwear for Industrial Workers-Requirements). Employees employed in the following areas and employees engaged in the operation of the following equipment are exempted:

- (a) Offices on piers or marine terminals;
- (b) Rest rooms and cafeterias;
- (c) Cranes with enclosed cabs;
- (d) Vehicles with adequate overhead protection;
- (e) Terminal gates;
- (f) Container freight stations.

When employees leave the above equipment or areas to work on a marine terminal or aboard a vessel, or where the employer has issued or posted instructions that hard hats are required despite the above exceptions, employees shall wear their hard hats.

There have been many problems with missing knobs from autos at Long Beach 83. Just a reminder from the PCLCD:

17.8 Penalties for work stoppages, assault, *pilferage*, drunkenness, drug abuse and peddling, safety violations and other offenses.

17.822 Pilferage.

17.8221 For first offense pilferage: Minimum penalty, 60 days' suspension from work. Maximum penalty, discretionary.

17.8222 For second offense pilferage: Mandatory cancellation from registered list upon request of the employer.
