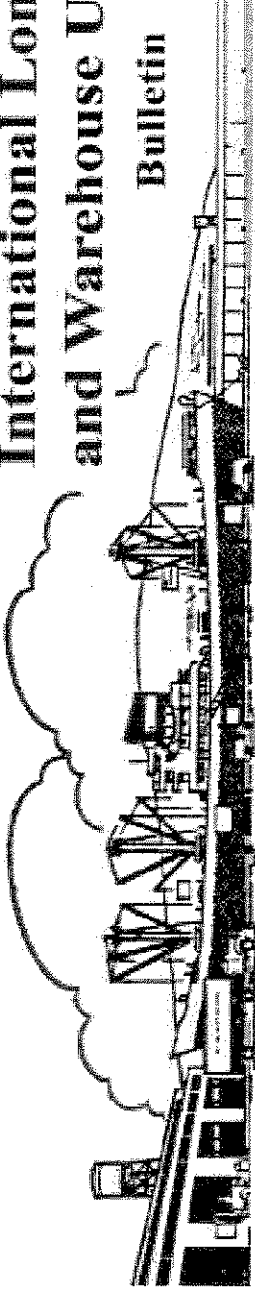

CASUALTY BOARD UPDATES

Members qualified for dispatch on the Casualty Board or on a Red Number, are responsible for monitoring their eligibility. If your time is due to expire, **YOU WILL NOT BE NOTIFIED BY THE LOCAL OR PMA.**

For all check-in privileges, your doctor's note **must be received** in the Health Benefits office by **3:30 p.m.** daily.

The following information is required:

- Full name and registration number
- Class "A" or "B" and shift (day/night)
- Type of restrictions and length of light duty status
- Signature and date of doctor
- Contact phone number for the doctor and the member
- All Class "B" notes must be stamped by PMA
- All doctor's notes must be legible
- Faxed notes **will not** be accepted

Reminder: You are responsible for your placement on the board. There are no extensions without your doctor's authorization. There is no grace period. You will not be placed on the board, or permitted an extension at dispatch.

The Casualty Board is for a temporary accommodation lasting up to six (6) months. If you require an accommodation for more than six (6) months, you will be required to present documentation to the Joint Port Labor Relations Committee (JPLRC).

NOTICE

Per LRC meeting, SCLB-0133-2002, September 22, 2002, all Class "A" and "B" Casualty Board requests must be submitted through the Health Benefits Offices to be processed by the JPLRC.

Initial Casualty Board or Red Number privileges are granted for up to sixty (60) days upon receipt of proper medical documentation.

For all claims of disability over sixty (60) days, you must be examined by the ILWU/PMA neutral physician for an evaluation that may extend privilege for an additional sixty (60) days.
